



### Vitreous Veils in a Patient with Marfan Syndrome

Vitreous humor is often present as veils or discrete fibrils in patients with connective tissue disorders. This 24-year-old woman with Marfan syndrome was bilaterally aphakic secondary to posterior dislocation of the crystalline lens. Vitreous was seen as discrete fibrils resembling spider's feet in the retropupillary area in the right eye (**A, B**) and in the left eye (**C, D**). These veils are often scattered in the vitreous cavity, and the areas in between the veils seem optically empty, best appreciated by slit-lamp examination as shown.
